**PSA Annual International Conference:** The Greek Politics Specialist Group participated in the PSA Annual International Conference in Cardiff on 26-28 March 2018. GPSG was the organiser of two panels titled 'Migration and Identity in Southern Europe: Lived Experiences, Attitudes and Transformations' and 'Intergenerational Inequality and Crisis in Greece'. GPSG was also the co-organiser of three joint panels titled 'Party Leaders in Europe: Discourse, Ideas and Interests', 'New Parties, Party Systems and the Populist Moment (1)', and 'New Parties, Party Systems and the Populist Moment (2)'.

**Symposium at the Scottish Parliament:** The Greek and German Politics Specialist Groups co-organised a symposium at the Scottish Parliament aiming to explore the dynamics and trade-offs of refugee policies and politics in Germany, Greece and the United Kingdom – and the implications of these for Scotland. The event took place on 15 June and was sponsored by Colin Beattie (Member of the Scottish Parliament) and jointly funded by the Political Studies Association (Pushing the Boundaries Award) and the ESRC/AHRC as part of their contribution to the Global Challenges Research Fund (Award Reference: ES/P005189/1).

#### **Methodological seminar at the Centre for Political Research:**

The GPSG organised a four-day intensive seminar delving into methodological issues in research for social movements, co-organised by the University of Sheffield, the University of Exeter and the Centre for Political Research of Panteion University, Athens. The seminar involved 19 postgraduate students and PhD candidates at advanced stages of their postgraduate research. It brought together scholars from history, political science, sociology and communication to debate on major approaches in the research on social movements. It was hosted at the Centre for Political Research, from 17 to 20 September, and taught in English and Greek. The seminar was generously funded by the University of Sheffield (Max Batley Peace Studies fund) and co-sponsored by GPSG.

#### **Panel Discussion at the Onassis Cultural Centre:**

The GPSG co-convened a two-panels discussion on the political participation of the Greek diaspora with the SEESOX (University of Oxford) and Dianeosis. The event was hosted by the Onassis Cultural Centre “Stegi Grammaton Kai Technon” in Athens on 29 October 2018, from 18:00 to 20:30. The first panel focused on the political participation of the Greeks leaving abroad and the second on the specific theme of political representation of the expats.
