

The 3rd GPSG-BSA webinar on Modern Greek Studies will take place on Monday 19 April, at 19.00 Athens time. Dr Antonis A. Ellinas, Associate Professor at the University of Cyprus will give a talk on Right-wing extremism and antifascist mobilization in Greece. His presentation will be commented by Dr Vasiliki Georgiadou, Professor of Political Science at Panteion University.



Abstract

The voluminous literature on the far right largely treats it as a national and discursive phenomenon. I examine, instead, local and organizational aspects of right-wing extremism. I focus on the subnational development of right-wing extremist party organizations to turn attention to how local societies respond to extremism. I discuss the societal responses to right-wing extremism in Greece by focusing on the main actors, resources and tactics of the antifascist movement. I explore spatial and temporal patterns of antifascist mobilization and assess its effects on right-wing extremism.

Antonis A. Ellinas is Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of Cyprus. He received his Ph.D. from Princeton University and his B.A. from Hamilton College. He works on comparative European politics. He is the author of *Organizing against Democracy* (Cambridge University Press 2020), *The European Commission and Bureaucratic Autonomy* (Cambridge University Press 2012; with Ezra Suleiman) and *The Media and the Far Right* (Cambridge University Press 2010). His work has appeared in *Comparative Politics*, *West European Politics*, *the Journal of European Public Policy*, *the Journal of Common Market Studies*, *Party Politics*, *South European Society and Politics* and *Political Psychology*, among others. He chairs the Department of Social and Political Sciences and co-edits the *Journal of Modern Greek Studies* (Johns Hopkins University Press).

Vasiliki Georgiadou is a professor of political science at the Department of Political Science and History (Panteion University) and the director of the *Centre for Political Research*. She holds a Ph.D. from the Faculty of Philosophy of the Westphalian Wilhelms University of Münster. Her research interests focus on far-right parties, populism, radicalism, and political extremism. She was a regular member of the *National Council against Racism and Intolerance in Greece (2016-2019)*. She is now participating in the

Horizon 2020 program “[EnTrust. Enlightened Trust: An examination of trust and distrust in governance](#)”.
