The Greek Politics Specialist Group is opening three different calls for papers for the upcoming PSA 2023 Annual Conference, University of Liverpool, UK April 3-5

1. PSA 2023 Annual Conference – General Call for Papers on Greek Politics

One of the core aims of the Greek Politics Specialist Group (GPSG) of the Political Studies Association (PSA) is to organise focused, scholarly panels at the annual conference of the PSA, featuring senior and junior academics and researchers working on the field of Greek politics. The GPSG has a consistent and strong presence at PSA annual conferences, while also promoting collaborations with other Specialist Groups and international networks.

The 2023 Political Studies Association (PSA) Annual Conference will take place in **Liverpool** and its theme is '**Political Futures**'. For full details regarding all aspects of

The **GPSG** cordially **invites** scholars to submit **paper and panel proposals on all aspects of Greek society and politics**. We wish to particularly encourage comparative, cross-disciplinary and collaborative proposals, as well as papers featuring original theoretical ideas and empirical data. Moreover, we particularly welcome submissions from junior scholars and scholars from under-represented groups. All methodological and epistemological approaches based on sound social science reasoning are welcome.

Please send your proposals for papers (consisting of a **paper title, 200-word abstract, institutional affiliation and full contact details**) or panels (with **full details of the papers and authors**) to our Panel Convenors Dimitris Skleparis (dimitris.skleparis@newcastle.ac.uk) and Vasiliki (Billy) Tsagkroni (v.tsagkroni@fsw.leidenuniv.nl), who will be happy to respond to any enquires about this call or the conference.

The **deadline** for submitting proposals is **Monday 26 September 2022**. Applicants will be notified whether they have been included in the GPSG's panels ahead of the final PSA deadline (before 5th October).

2. Call for Papers, Greek Politics and Turkish Politics Specialist Groups, Joint Panel

The **Greek and Turkish Politics Specialist Groups** of the PSA welcome papers for a **joint panel**, marking the centenary of the **Lausanne Treaty in 1923**. Taking stock of 100 years of bilateral relations, papers can cover any aspect of state formation in Greece and Turkey and relations between the two nations, including how the history of nationalism and state building impacts relations between the two countries today. Papers with a longitudinal focus covering both Greece and Turkey would be preferred within the general theme of "**100 Years since the Lausanne Treaty: Reflections on State-Building, Nationalism and Peace**".

The PSA's Annual Conference 2023 will be held at the **University of Liverpool**. It plans to combine **both in-person and digital presentations**. Therefore, we welcome papers which will be presented digitally as well as those which will be presented in-person (**please state which format you would prefer in your abstract**).
